A Lifetime of Serving

Gwynne I. Rogers, age 94, a long-time resident of Jefferson City, MO, passed away Thursday, February 24, 2022 at home surrounded by family.

Gwynne was born on September 29, 1927 in Amityville, New York to Walter Ihlenburg and Anna (Grobet) Ihlenburg. She graduated from Forest Hills High School (New York) in 1945.

Gwynne met her future husband, Paul S. Rogers, in 1943 at a canteen for soldiers held at Calvary Baptist Church in New York City. Four years later, they were married in a ceremony at the Merchant Marine Academy at Kings Point, Long Island. Throughout their 69 years together, Paul and Gwynne shared a deep and abiding love and devotion to one another and to their family and friends.

In addition to being a loving wife to Paul, Gwynne was a dedicated Mom to their three sons: Scott (1950), Russ (1953) and Don (1958). She was also a proud Grammy to Rachel, Nathan, Lindsay, Travis and Megan and a thrilled great-Grammy beyond.

Gwynne was a long-time member of First Baptist Church, a volunteer at Mission friends, a Sunday School and Daily Vacation Bible School teacher, and a mentor at Park View Chapel. She also served as a regular volunteer at Memorial Community Hospital and was a member of the Christian Women's Club.

Since 1947, Gwynne's favorite role and clearly her calling was that of being the heart of her family. Gwynne's other gifts, in addition to husband-adoring and son-raising, included home-making, organizing, decorating, praying, helping others and being a safe haven for life's conversations. Over her many years of faithful service both to her family and beyond, she supported and encouraged so many others with her attentive way, sensitive heart, and thoughtful, quiet kindnesses.

Gwynne was preceded in death by her husband, Paul, and brother, Walter (Bud) Ihlenburg of Virginia Beach, VA.
