

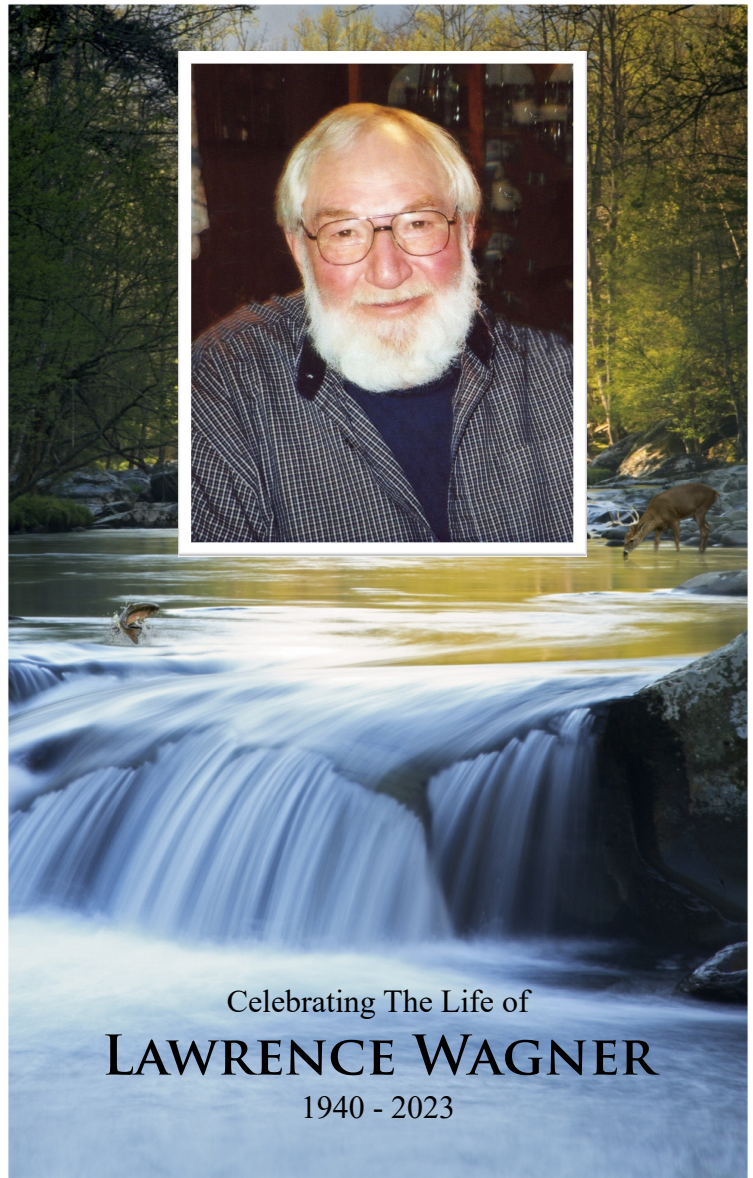
*"GONE FISHIN"*

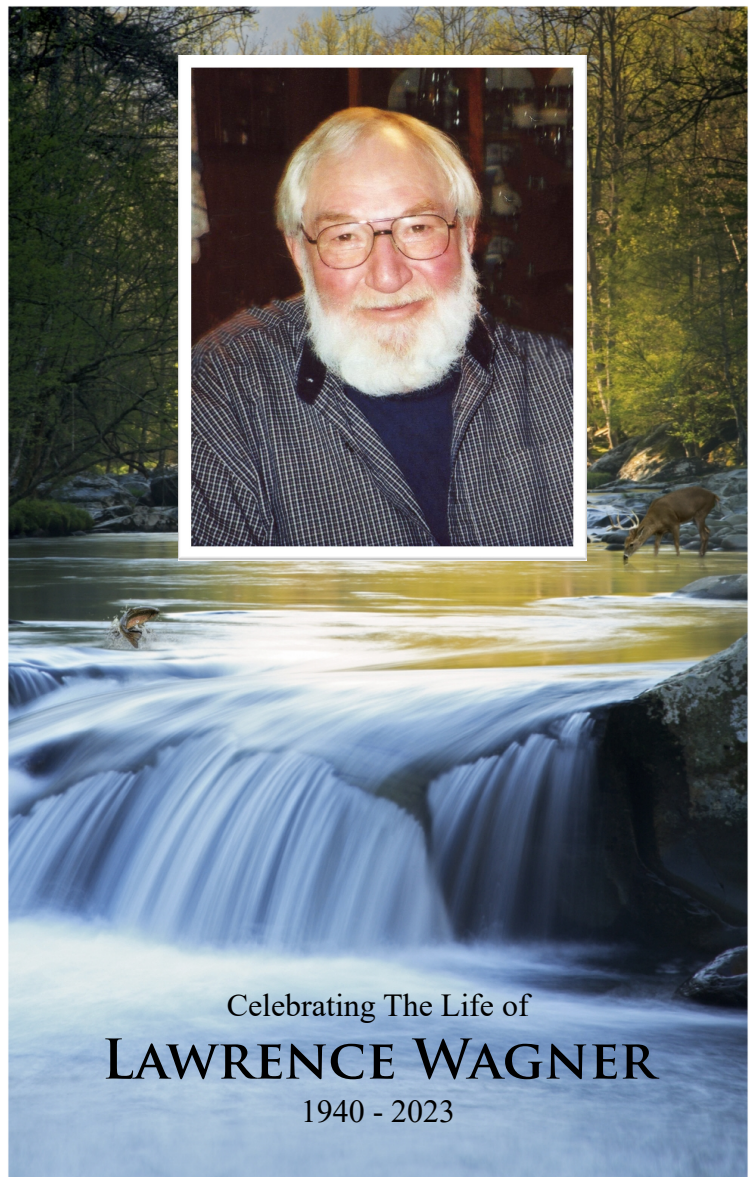
